

Applying for Reinstatement of your MD License

You are required to send the NMMB a written request for a reinstatement application. You may email your request to nmmb@state.nm.us, fax it to 505-476-7237 or mail it to the New Mexico Medical Board 2055 S. Pacheco Street, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505.

➤ **LICENSE REINSTATEMENT WITHIN TWO YEARS OF RENEWAL DATE:** A license that has been suspended for non-renewal, placed in inactive, or voluntary lapsed status may be reinstated within two years of the renewal date by submitting the following:

- a completed renewal application
- application fees
- proof of completion of required continuing medical education for the current year and the previous renewal cycle
- a list of licenses held in any other state(s) and license status.

➤ **FEES:**

- License summarily suspended for non-renewal \$ 1000.00
- Voluntary Lapsed Status \$ 1000.00
- Inactive Status \$ 800.00

➤ **LICENSE REINSTATEMENT AFTER TWO YEARS FROM RENEWAL DATE:** Restoration of a medical license to active status after two years from the renewal date requires the physician demonstrate continued competence to practice medicine with the following documentation:

- a completed reinstatement application
- application fee
- proof of completion of 75 hours of continuing medical education during the past three licensing years (AMA Category 1)
- applicants who have not been in active practice for the previous two years may be required to pass an examination for current competency
- in addition the board may require a personal interview with a board member and/or interview with the entire board at a regularly scheduled meeting
- consistent with the provisions of the Medical Practice Act, Section 61-6-30 NMSA 1978, the board may impose terms and conditions on the reinstated license.

➤ **FEES:**

- License summarily suspended for non-renewal \$ 1000.00
- Voluntary Lapsed Status \$ 1000.00
- Inactive Status \$ 800.00

Reinstatement licenses are issued for a period not less than 24 months or more than 36 months from the date of approval.

All reinstatement applications will be subject to a statewide criminal history screening. Reinstatement applications shall be processed pending the completion of the statewide criminal history screening and may be granted while the screening still pending. If the statewide criminal background screening reveals a felony or a violation of the Medical Practice Act, the licensee will be notified to submit copies of legal documents and other related information to the board which will make the determination if the applicant is eligible for licensure or if disciplinary action will be taken.
