WELCOME NEW BOARD MEMBER DR. FRANK CRESPIN, MD, MPH

*O*n November 9, 2007, Governor Richardson appointed Dr. Frank Crespin as a professional member of the NM Medical Board. The Board welcomed Dr. Crespin at their November 15-16, 2007 board meeting.

Dr. Frank Crespin is the Chief Medical Officer at La Clinica de Familia, Inc. (LCDF) in Las Cruces, New Mexico. LCDF is a nonprofit corporation providing medical, dental, and social services to 29,000 clients yearly. Dr. Crespin earned his Masters in Public Health with a concentration in Health Services from the University of Washington School of Public Health and Community Medicine in Seattle and attended medical school at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City. He completed a Family Medicine residency at Saginaw Cooperative Hospitals in Saginaw, Michigan and a Family Medicine Faculty Development Fellowship at the Michigan State School of Human Medicine in East Lansing.

From 1984—1990, Dr. Crespin was on the clinical staff of LCDF, serving as Medical Director from 1985-1990. In 1990, he accepted the position of Health Officer with the New Mexico Department of Health where he oversaw various public health programs in an eight-county area of southwestern New Mexico. In 1996, Dr. Crespin returned to LCDF as the Chief Medical Officer. Dr. Crespin is on the medical staff at two hospitals in Las Cruces, Memorial Medical Center and Mountain View Regional Medical Center. He is certified by the American Board of Family Medicine, American Board of Preventive Medicine, and the Certifying Commission in Medical Management. Dr. Crespin is a fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians and the American College of Preventive Medicine.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

For a 30 day session, 2008 was certainly busy and productive in spite of the failure to enact health reform. A few of the bills of interest to the NM Medical Board during the session and the status of each bill as of March 6, 2008 are summarized below.

HB 177 Amending the Medical Practice Act to grant the NMMB authority to issue emergency summary suspensions of licenses under certain conditions **was signed** by the Governor.

SB 127 Authorizing the NMMB to waive licensure fees for applicants who choose New Mexico as the first state of licensure to promote medical doctor recruitment **was signed** by the Governor. SB 127 also extends the Sunset date of the Medical Practice Act from 2009 to 2015.

SB 269 creating the Polysomnography Practice Act and providing for licensure of Polysomnographic Technicians & Technologists under the NMMB **was signed** by the Governor.

SB 415 amending the Medical Practice Act to include licensing requirements for Genetic Counselors under the NMMB **was signed** by the Governor.

HB 89 amending the Umbilical Cord Blood Banking Act to add Physician Assistants under the definitions of health care providers **was signed** by the Governor.

HB 37 requiring the NM Telehealth & Health Information Technology Commission to develop plans for implementing electronic insurance and medical record systems **did not pass**.

SB 485 amending the Medical Practice Act to expand Anesthesiologist Assistants' services to all of New Mexico by revising the employment requirements and increasing the number of Anesthesiologist Assistants an Anesthesiologist may supervise **did not pass**.



CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS

PROGRESS REPORT

*I*n January 2008, the NMMB mailed out fingerprint cards, instructions for completing the fingerprint cards, authorization forms, a criminal history screening general information sheet, and a list of locations where fingerprinting is available, to all physicians renewing by July 2008. The completed cards should be returned to the NMMB office by the licensee.

For Physicians renewing in 2009 and 2010, the fingerprint cards and information data will be mailed in January of your renewal year. The NMMB will accept fingerprint cards from all physicians, regardless of the expiration date, so don't hesitate to have your fingerprints taken at any time. Fingerprints must be taken on cards with the NMMB identification code and stamp. If you need fingerprint cards, or your hospital or clinic would like to sponsor a fingerprinting opportunity, contact the Board office to request cards and instructions.

We started fingerprinting July 1, 2007. Anyone licensed after July 1, 2007 should have fingerprints on file with the NMMB, so it will not be necessary to re-submit for renewal.

ATTENTION RENEWING LICENSEES:

Fingerprint cards MUST be mailed to the Board office with a check or money order for \$34.00, payable to the NMMB. You will NOT be able to pay the \$34.00 fee on-line with your renewal.

There are two (2) separate fees associated with the fingerprinting process. The *fingerprinting* fee, is payable to the fingerprinting service and varies from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per card, depending on the fingerprinting service you choose. The *processing* fee is payable to the NMMB in the amount of \$34.00. (The Department of Public Safety (DPS) charges the NMMB this fee for state and federal processing.) If you are renewing, these two fees are in addition to your renewal fee.

Reminders:

- ⇒ The FBI does not allow criminal background screening documents to be shared from agency to agency.
- ⇒ Fingerprints can be taken by a fingerprinting service in another state, as long as the fingerprinting service uses the NM Medical Board fingerprint cards.
- ⇒ The fingerprinting process is a ONE-TIME-ONLY requirement, unless the NMMB is notified by the FBI or DPS that the prints are not classifiable or of poor quality, and new fingerprints are necessary.
 - Reasons for FBI or DPS rejections include: ink too light; ink too dark; use of red ink (should only use black ink); fingertips not completely rolled; prints appear smudged; or ridges are not otherwise identifiable when scanned.
 - A visual review of the prints at the time of fingerprinting may identify one of the aforementioned descriptors and eliminate returning to the fingerprint service for a resubmission because the FBI or DPS has rejected the prints *after* scanning as unreadable.
- ⇒ The fingerprint requirement will NOT DELAY the renewal process unless you do not submit the fingerprint cards. Renewal licenses will be issued while the background screening is pending. Neglecting to complete and submit the cards will slow down the renewal process.
- ⇒ On-line renewal will be available on or shortly after April 1, 2008, so you will still be able to renew online using your credit card; however, the fingerprint cards will need to be mailed to the NMMB office.
- The Criminal History Screening question and answer information, as well as, the Fingerprint Source List are available on the Board's web site at www.nmmb.state.nm.us.
- The NMMB would like to thank you for your cooperation! We appreciate your efforts in complying with this new regulation.

BOARD ACTIONS

(Actions taken between September 16, 2007 and February 29, 2008)

Krell, Douglas, MD, License #82-234—issued a Stipulation restricting the physician from treating patients with chronic pain for more than 30 days. (September 2007)

Lewis, Joan, MD, License #94-300—issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (NCA) based on injudicious prescribing. (November 2007)

Nicholas, Winslow, MD, License #91-274—after a Default Hearing, issued an Order to revoke the license based on surrender of a license to practice medicine by another state while an investigation was pending. (November 2007)

Northcutt, Craig, MD, License #92-109—issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (NCA) based on repeated similar negligent acts. (November 2007)

Orchard, Robert, MD, License #2000-84—issued a Stipulated License with standard substance abuse stipulations. (February 2008)

Schwartz, George, MD, License #71-84—issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (NCA) for failure to comply with the Parental Responsibility Act.

Schwartz, Howard, MD, #2003-0494—issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (NCA) based on injudicious prescribing; deceptive statements made in response to the complaint; and maintaining inadequate records. (November 2007)

Van Wormer, Mark, MD, License #81-333—issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (NCA) based on allegations similar to count 13 of a pending federal indictment against the physician that he misbranded drugs and misled patients as to what drugs he was treating them with. His conduct specifically violated the Medical Practice Act in the following ways: use of false, fraudulent and deceptive statements in documents connected with the practice of medicine; conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public; improper management of medical records, including failure to maintain timely, accurate, legible and complete medical records; and making false statements or misleading statements regarding the efficacy or value of medication, treatment or remedy prescribed or administered by the licensee or at the direction of the licensee in the treatment of a disease or other condition of the human mind or body. In a Stipulated Order, Dr. Van Wormer's license was suspended. (November 2007)

Start Spreading the News . . . Application Fee to be Waived by the NMMB!

Beginning July 1, 2008, The New Mexico Medical Board (NMMB) is waiving the licensure application fee for applicants who choose New Mexico **as their first state of licensure**.

In collaboration with the Governor's Health Solutions, NM Legislature, the NM Medical Society and the University of New Mexico, the NMMB voted to waive the application fee on a trial basis in an effort to recruit and retain physicians in New Mexico.

The authority to waive the fee just passed the 2008 Legislature and was signed by Governor Richardson pursuant to Senate Bill 127.

We encourage you to let your new physician friends know about this enticing incentive to move to the Land of Enchantment.

The Board will review the impact to the budget during the next fiscal year and determine the feasibility of this action annually.

TWO IMPORTANT WAYS YOU CAN SERVE YOUR PROFESSION WHILE EARNING CMES

Impaired Physician Committee (IPC)

When the Board has reason to believe that a physician or physician assistant is impaired in some manner, either through substance abuse, mental health issues, or physical illness, the NM Impaired Health Care Provider Act authorizes the creation of a committee to examine that provider and make recommendation to the Board. We call these Impaired Physician Committees (IPCs), and they are created on a case-by-case basis. We are always looking for volunteers to assist the Board with this important function.

Three licensed health care providers constitute an IPC examining committee. In general, we try to create an IPC that best matches the situation at hand. For example, a neurosurgeon who appears to have a substance abuse problem might meet with an IPC psychiatrist with expertise in substance abuse, a second physician or psychiatrist, and then a fellow neurosurgeon, someone who understands the specific stresses the physician in question might be facing.

Traditionally the Board has relied on the goodwill of volunteers to work on the IPCs, and we extend our greatest thanks to all of you who have been so willing to serve. We are seeing an increase in the number of cases that might be referred to an Impaired Physician Committee, and we do not want to interrupt the busy schedules of the same volunteers time after time. For volunteer participants, the New Mexico Medical Society (NMMS) will provide CME certificates for 2-3 credit hours, and the NMMB will reimburse IPC members' travel costs.

Medical Legal Panel

The NM Medical Review Commission, the mandatory malpractice review panel consisting of volunteers from the medical and legal professions, needs panelists and expert witnesses. The medical legal panels are part of the Medical Malpractice Act, and must review cases before they can proceed to court. Hearings are held Mondays through Thursdays beginning at 7pm in Albuquerque at the Marshall Building located at 7770 Jefferson NE, #400. CME is offered. Participants who live outside of Albuquerque are reimbursed for mileage. 16.10.6 Complaint Procedure & Institution of Disciplinary Action: adding Section 29 Parental Responsibility Act Compliance that outlines the regulations for complying with the Parental Responsibility Act.

16.10.13 Delegated Use of Devices and Procedures by Medical Assistants; Cosmetic Injections: clarifying the definition of "medical therapeutic or cosmetic medical procedure device, or treatment" and adding a "Public Communication" section addressing advertising cosmetic procedures.

16.10.16 Administering, Prescribing and Distribution of Medications: removing the archaic formulary language for PA prescribing.

PHYSICIAN RENEWALS APRIL 1ST THROUGH JUNE 30TH

On-line renewals begin on April 1st—the fastest, easiest way to renew your license! Go to www.nmmb.state.nm.us and follow the link to renewals. If you have any difficulty, call the Board office and staff will be happy to assist you.

ATTENTION RENEWING LICENSEES:

Fingerprint cards MUST be mailed to the Board office with a check or money order for \$34.00, payable to the NMMB. You will NOT be able to pay the \$34.00 fee on-line with your renewal.

There are two (2) separate fees associated with the fingerprinting process. The *fingerprinting* fee, is payable to the fingerprinting service and varies from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per card, depending on the fingerprinting service you choose. The *processing* fee is payable to the NMMB in the amount of \$34.00. (The Department of Public Safety (DPS) charges the NMMB this fee for state and federal processing.) If you are renewing, these two fees are in addition to your renewal fee.

- Paper renewals must be requested from the Board office—(505) 476-7220.
- Check your CME hours NOW! You will need **75 hours** of CME for renewal. Don't send us the documentation unless we ask for it ... but if we ask for it, make sure you have it!
- If you cannot get your CME finished by the **June 30th renewal deadline**, contact the office **before June 30th** and request an emergency deferral.
- Remember: When you sign your renewal application, or when you click the final box on-line, you are affirming that your answers to all of the questions are *complete and true*. Falsification of a renewal application is grounds for discipline. Take the time to have a second look at your answers. If someone on your staff has prepared your renewal for you, make certain you review all of the answers before sending the form in to the Board.
- If all else fails, you can renew late—and pay late fees as specified in Board rules. But if you haven't renewed or changed your license status by October 1st, your license will be summarily suspended for non-renewal and you will no longer be able to practice medicine legally!

Physician's Responsibility to Report to the Board

Physicians have a responsibility to report certain actions to the NM Medical Board, pursuant to Section 61-6-15 (21) of the Medical Practice Act (MPA) and Section 13 of 16.10.10 NMAC.

What: Reportable actions include **adverse** *actions* taken while licensed or unlicensed in another state; actions taken by:

- (a) another licensing jurisdiction;
- (b) a peer review body (i.e., The Medical Review Commission is considered a governmental agency and actions are reportable);
- (c) a health care entity;
- (d) a professional or medical society or association;
- (e) any governmental agency;
- (f) any law enforcement agency; or
- (g) any court for acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct that would constitute grounds for action under the Medical Practice Act. An action includes settlements, judgments or dismissals, with or without penalty.

When: Reports *MUST* be received by the NMMB within 45 days from the date the action occurs. The "action occurs" when the decision-making body makes the decision. An appeal of the decision does not alter or add to the time of the reporting requirement.

Possible Sanctions: The Board may impose a civil penalty, up to \$2,000, for failure to report medical malpractice payments.

Remember, *when in doubt*, contact the Board Office. It is better to *report* all actions, than to miss reporting a claim that is required.

The Board Issued 26 New Physician Assistant Licenses between September 16, 2007 and February 29, 2008

A Public Service License Is Only Valid While In A Residency Program.

A Public Service (PS) license is a limited license to practice medicine under the rules of the Locum Tenens program of the UNM Health Sciences Center.

A PS license may be issued to physicians who have successfully completed one year of Postgraduate Training (PGT) and have the *written permission* of their Chief of Service. The physician must also be in a Board-approved training program and hold an "active" PGT license. Both the *PS and PGT licenses* become null & void upon completion of the residency program.

A PS license is renewable annually on September 1st, *providing* all requirements are met. If not renewed during *continuing* PGT, the PS license will expire on September 1st of that year. Continued practice with a PS license *after* completing a PGT program is a violation of the Medical Practice Act.

Physician licenses expire on July 1, of the triennial year, unless renewed. *Anesthesiologist Assistant* licenses expire on July 1, of each odd-numbered year, unless renewed.
