

BOARD ACTIONS

(Actions taken between April 1, 2017 through June 31, 2017)

Wilson Fulla Bernales, MD – Applicant – Amended Decision and Order of the Board to revoke Dr. Bernales’ license to practice medicine in New Mexico and further is not eligible for reinstatement unless he successfully applies for and is granted re-licensure. This action is based on misrepresentation when applying for renewal, conduct unbecoming or detrimental to the best interests of the public, failure to report adverse action to the Board and other adverse action taken by another jurisdiction. (May 2017).

Judith Brillman, MD – License no. 89-9 – Stipulation and Order for Voluntary Surrender of License while under investigation. (May 2017)

Karen Concilio, PA – License no. PA2010-0005 - Stipulation of Licensure mandating that physician abstain from the use of mind-altering substances, alcohol and non-prescribed controlled substances and must enter into a treatment contract with NM Monitored Treatment Program. This is not considered a restriction on the license. (June 2017)

Christopher Fletcher, MD – License no. 81-45 – Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Dr. Fletcher successfully complete Western Institute of Legal Medicine’s “Practical Medical Ethics and Professionalism” course within six months of this order. Also, Dr. Fletcher must pay to the Board a fine in the sum of \$1,000.00. This action is based on conduct unbecoming in a person licensed to practice or detrimental to the best interests of the public. (May 2017)

John Flores, MD – License No. 2002-0142 – Stipulation and Order for Voluntary Surrender of License based on the prescribing of narcotic, stimulant or hypnotic drugs for other than accepted therapeutic purposes; conduct likely to harm the public; repeated similar negligent acts; injudicious prescribing; conduct unbecoming in a person licensed to practice or detrimental to the best interests of the public and improper management of medical records including failure to maintain timely, accurate, legible and complete medical records. (May 2017)

Shabbar Hussain, MD – Applicant - Decision and Order of the Board granting a license to practice medicine conditioned upon his practice being proctored by direct supervision by a Board approved physician. This order is based on the Hearing Officers Report filed with the Board on March 6, 2017. (April 2017)

Joseph Jaros, MD – License no. 90-216 – Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Dr. Jaros successfully complete “Prescribing Controlled Drugs: Critical Issues and Common Pitfalls” and “CPEP Medical Record Keeping” within six months of the issued order. This action is based on the use of false, fraudulent or deceptive statements in a document connected with

the practice of medicine; injudicious prescribing; and improper management of medical records, including failure to maintain timely, accurate legible and complete medical records. (April 2017)

Douglas Krell, MD – License no. 82-234 – Order of Release from Stipulation in Case No. 2007-011. Licensee has a full and unrestricted license. (May 2017)

Douglas Krell, MD – License no. 82-234 – Order of Release from Stipulation in Case No. 2014-036. Licensee has a full and unrestricted license. (May 2017)

Wayne Kuang, MD – License no. MD2006-0203- Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Dr. Kuang successfully complete Western Institute of Legal Medicine’s “Practical Medical Ethics and Professionalism” course within six months of this order. Also, Dr. Kuang must pay to the Board a fine in the sum of \$1,000.00. This action is based on failure to adequately supervise. (May 2017)

Ryan Lubert, MD - License no. MD2007-0515 – Stipulation of Licensure mandating that physician abstain from the use of mind-altering substances, alcohol and non-prescribed controlled substances and must enter into a treatment contract with NM Monitored Treatment Program. This is not considered a restriction on the license. (June 2017)

Adrian Maestas, MD – License no. MD2017-0304 – Stipulation of Licensure mandating that physician abstain from the use of mind-altering substances, alcohol and non-prescribed controlled substances and must enter into a treatment contract with NM Monitored Treatment Program. This is not considered a restriction on the license. (May 2017)

Maria Martinez Ugarte, MD – License no. MD2013-0518 - Stipulation of Licensure mandating that physician must enter into a monitoring contract with NM Monitored Treatment Program to monitor her ongoing physical condition. This is not considered a restriction on the license. (April 2017)

Aaron Mayberry, MD – License no. 2001-71 – Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Dr. Mayberry successfully complete Western Institute of Legal Medicine’s “Practical Medical Ethics and Professionalism” course within six months of this order. Also, Dr. Mayberry must pay to the Board a fine in the sum of \$1,000.00. This action is based on failure to adequately supervise. (May 2017)

Michelle Ratliff, MD – License no. PA2004-0049 – Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Ms. Ratliff undergo a comprehensive neuropsychological evaluation by a provider approved by the Board within ninety days of the date of the order. This action is based on misrepresentation when applying for or procuring renewal. (May 2017)

Suparna Saha, MD – License no. MD2011-0640 – Stipulation of Licensure and Order of Reprimand requiring that Dr. Saha take and pass the Spex exam within six months of this order. This action is based on failure to report an adverse action taken against Dr. Saha by another licensing jurisdiction. (May 2017)

Paul Willette, MD – License no. MD2013-0738 – Decision and Order of the Board revoking Dr. Willette's license to practice medicine in New Mexico, based on the adoption of the Hearing Officers Report filed with the NM Medical Board on February 27, 2017. (April 2017)

Douglas Wills, MD – Applicant - Stipulation and Order for Withdrawal of Initial Application. Per Stipulation, Dr. Wills withdrew his application for licensure in New Mexico while under investigation. This action is based on the best interest of the public's health, safety and welfare. (June 2017)
