LEGISLATIVE UPDATE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Listed below are a few of the bills that the New Mexico Medical Board followed during the recent 2009 Legislative Session.

HB 14—Authorizes the Chiropractic Board to enhance their scope of practice and formulary; removes the requirement for NMMB approval of the formulary. **SIGNED** by the Governor.

HB 170—Amends the Vital Statistics Act to allow nurse practitioners to complete & sign medical certifications of cause of death. **SIGNED** by the Governor.

HB 492 & HB 789—Directs the Acupuncture Board to issue certifications to DOMs in 4 expanded practices: basic injection therapy, injection therapy, intravenous therapy, & bioidentical hormone therapy. **DID NOT PASS** out of Committee.

HB 498—Amends sections of the Medical Radiation Health & Safety Act. **SIGNED** by the Governor.

HB 536—Amends the definition of an Anesthesiologist Assistant to remove the employment restriction requiring that a physician anesthesiologist and an anesthesiologist assistant be an employee of the department of anesthesiology of a medical school in New Mexico. DID NOT PASS out of Committee.

HB585 & SB 174—Enacts a Scope of Practice Act which provides for a process to review the scopes of practice of certain licensed health professionals. DID NOT PASS out of Committee.

HB 664—Enacts the Unlicensed Health Care Practice Act. This bill permits a complementary & alternative healthcare practitioner, who is not licensed by a regulatory board, to provide healthcare services. **SIGNED** by the Governor.

SB 278—Provides for the use, disclosure, retention & protection of electronic medical records; provides that a law or rule requiring a medical record to be in writing or to be signed is satisfied by an electronic medical record or electronic signature. **SIGNED** by the Governor.

SB 356—Deletes the requirement to obtain a registration for dispensing a controlled substance on an annual basis. SIGNED by the Governor.

Health Reform—Medical Malpractice Act—No bills proposing amendments to increase the cap on the limit of liability, thus increasing premiums, were introduced.

NATIONAL PROVIDER **IDENTIFIERS (NPIs) &**

ATTENTION PHYSICIANS:

A health care provider who is an individual, such as a physician or any other practitioner, is eligible for only one National Provider Identifier (NPI). A provider/organization may hold another NPI number for the business. Once the number is assigned, the NPI lasts "for life", cannot be changed and has no expiration date. The NPI is used to identify you in transactions with all health plans across the country. If you change your practice location, telephone number, specialization, or any other information continued in your National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES) record, you are required to update your NPPES record accordingly.

It is very important to deactivate your NPI in NPPES when the NPI will no longer be used.

If you voluntarily surrender your license or retire and you will no longer be furnishing health care in this or any other state, please remember to deactivate your NPI in the NPPES. Deactivating your NPI will help ensure that your NPI is not used fraudulently by others. If you do not know how to deactivate your NPI. you may contact the NPI Enumerator at 1-800-465-3203 for assistance.

According to the NPPES, health care practitioners also need to notify health plan (s) in which they are enrolled, and to which they may send claims, that they have retired and will no longer be furnishing health care or submitting claims to the health plan (s).

Is Withdrawing an Application or Surrendering a License Reportable to the National Data Banks?

The withdrawal of an application for initial licensure is only required to be reported if it is withdrawn while under investigation. This is reported to the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank ("HIPDB"). Surrender of a license as it relates to disciplinary action regarding the physician's professional competence or conduct, is reportable to both HIPDB and the National Practitioner Data Bank ("NPDB"). Voluntary surrender of a license for personal reasons not related to disciplinary action, for e.g. retirement, is not reportable. When an action is reported, the data banks allow the applicant or licensee to add a statement to the report. The applicant's or licensee's statement will become a permanent part of that report. The withdrawal of an application while under investigation, or surrendering a license as it relates to disciplinary action, is also public information.

Keep Spreading the News . . . NMMB Continues to Waive Application Fees!

The New Mexico Medical Board (NMMB) will continue waiving the licensure application fee for applicants who choose New Mexico *as their first state of licensure*. This incentive began July 1, 2008, when the NMMB voted to waive the application fee on a trial basis in an effort to recruit and retain physicians in New Mexico. The Board will review the budgetary impact and determine the feasibility of continuing this promotion on an annual basis. Determining to waive this fee was a collaborative effort with the Governor's Health Solutions, NM Legislature, the NM Medical Society and the University of New Mexico pursuant to Senate Bill 127, passed in 2008.

License Status Defined

The Board would like to remind all physicians that if you do not renew your license by October 1 of the renewal year, the license status is automatically changed to "summarily suspended". The Board is aware that this status may denote possible disciplinary action to a hospital or credentialing agency looking at the Board's website for licensure information. So, as you will see in the article below, the Board will be proposing to clarify the definition of a license suspended for non-renewal. The proposed revisions would add definitions for "lapsed" and "suspended for non-renewal" to clarify that this status is for a physician who has failed to either renew their license or to change the license status to "inactive", "retired", or "voluntarily lapsed" status within 90 days after the license renewal date.

PROPOSED RULE REVISIONS

The Board is considering rule revisions to the following Parts as summarized below.

Please submit written comments prior to August 1, 2009. The Board will be reviewing the proposed rule revisions at the May quarterly meeting for a possible Rule Hearing at the August quarterly meeting. Once approved, a full copy of the proposed revisions will be posted on the Board's web site at www.nmmb.state.nm.us.

- **16.10.7** License Expiration, Renewal, and Reinstatement: Add definitions for a "lapsed" license and "suspended for non renewal" to clarify that a license that has not been renewed by September 30 of the expiration year has lapsed.
- **16.10.15** Physician Assistants: Licensure And Practice Requirements: Add definitions for a "lapsed" license and "suspended for non renewal" to clarify that a license that has not been renewed by March 1 of the expiration year has lapsed.
- **16.10.19** Qualifications & Licensure for Anesthesiologist Assistants: Add definitions for a "lapsed" license and "suspended for non renewal" to clarify that a license that has not been renewed by September 30 of the expiration year has lapsed.

ARE YOU AWARE...

"MUST DO'S" IN PHYSICIAN-PATIENT TREATMENT By Grant La Farge, M.D., Medical Director

All physicians are periodically asked by family and friends to diagnose on-the-spot, and prescribe. No doubt, most physicians have succumbed to the urge and expediency to self-diagnose or self-prescribe. Some important ethical and professional "musts" are missing from those scenarios.

The AMA "Code of Ethics" is quite specific about the physician-patient relationship, including confidentiality and an appropriate medical record with a history, physical examination, testing, diagnosis, recommendations, and treatment with informed consent. Hippocrates reminded us: "never do harm to anyone." Without such a preliminary, interactive encounter, a physician-patient relationship does not exist, and objectivity and professionalism are lost.

Self-prescription and prescription for family members further compromises objectivity, and the AMA Code of Ethics discourages that practice except in true emergencies where no other qualified physician is available.

Further, prescription of controlled substances for family or for self is always unwise, and raises the specters of addiction and diversion, especially in the eyes of pharmacists.

Also, in the current age of telemedicine and electronic prescription, we must not, as ethical physicians, sacrifice the safety of the patient and the integrity of the practice of medicine to the convenience of the Internet. It is of paramount importance to establish an ethical physician-patient relationship interactively before starting or continuing with clinical management using electronic media.

There are a very few exceptions to these principles: covering physicians; carefully defined instances of on-line urgent care or consultation; prescriptions written for examinations or immunization programs; or, "expedited partner therapy" for sexually transmitted diseases (in established programs).

In a social situation, a physician may legitimately recommend that a friend make an appointment with an appropriate specialist. However, if that physician undertakes to diagnose and to treat anyone not formally established as a patient, or family, or self, it calls into question not only underlying ethical propriety, but also that physician's judgment and the integrity of the patient, and may invoke the other consequence of "doing harm": malpractice liability.




