 Ms. Hart reported that out of 2,256 physicians eligible to renew, 75% renewed on-line, 461 have not yet renewed, and 213 went inactive. The web site is up-to-date. Ms. Tipton will send board members the web site link. The second late fee is now in effect Staff is currently processing CME audits. The Board audits 10% of all renewing licensees between April 1 and July 1. All licensees renewing after July 1, 2007 are required to provide proof of continuing medical education hours. The Board questioned whether or not someone that was not on the audit list might still be audited and the

response was yes. Even though a licensee may renew through October 1st, the continuing medical education hours should be taken between July 1, 2006 and July 1, 2007 Licensees may ask for a deferral

Ms Hart advised the Board of the Resident Physician status Currently, there are six licensed residents with incomplete applications. The lacking information is primarily program withdrawals, with one lacking return of the fingerprint card

PA Supervising Physician Statement of Responsibility Form

A Chairman

- Dr Kovnat announced that the Governor appointed Dr Robert McRoberts to replace Dr Alfredo Vigil as a professional member of the Board
- The Board adopted the 2008 Calendar for Board Meetings
- The next annual meeting of the FSMB is scheduled to be held in San Antonio, Texas in May 2008
- A brief discussion was held regarding initiating a consistent approach for dealing with DWI convictions Ms Hart was directed to conduct a study through the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) ExecNet to review what procedures other states follow

B Executive Director

In response to a Board directive, Ms. Hart provided the Board with results from an ExecNet survey through the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) asking if any states require public service as a condition of license renewal, or accept such service in lieu of CME hours. By public service, we mean anything from "pro bono" work to taking calls for the community emergency room. The survey indicated no other states require voluntary services be provided by physicians. The following comments dealt with physicians providing "pro bono" services, participation in accepting Medicare patients, and taking emergency room calls. Ms. Hart recommended the NM Medical Society consider surveying members on these questions versus the Board conducting a survey.

Ms Hart called on Ms. Mascarenas to provide the current budget status report She reported not all of the Fiscal Year 07 budget was expended; however, the fund balance was utilized to cover overall operating expenses due to an increase in audit costs and ISD services. The monitored treatment program and the medical director contracts will go out to bid by December 31, 2007. The contract for a monitored treatment program needs to be in place by July 1, 2008.

Ms Hart recommended Dr Kovnat appoint a Compliance Task Force to explore the current compliance process, what's working and what's not, as well as, participate in drafting the monitored treatment program contract. Dr Kovnat requested that anyone interested in participating contact him. Dr Lauriello agreed to participate on the task force.

Ms Hart presented the Board with a Fee Chart indicating the statutory limitations for the various services that have set fees in Part 9 of the Board's rules. The Board needs to raise fees to the statutory limit before going to the legislature requesting an increase in the statutory limits. Increasing fees will alleviate the need for using a percent of the fund balance to cover operating costs each year. Staff will provide the Board with a fee proposal for the September Interim meeting.

Ms Hart provided the Board with an invitation to attend the annual meeting of the New Mexico Hospital Association on September 20, 2007

Ms Hart reported she attended the New Mexico Medical Society's Executive Committee meeting on Saturday, August 11, 2007 She gave a presentation on the Board's criminal background check through fingerprinting initiative, as well as, announcing that fingerprint checks will be required during the next three years renewal cycle. The NM Medical Society volunteered to assist the Board in spreading the news regarding the fingerprint requirement by way of their web site and newsletter. Ms Walker was directed to compile a list of agencies that provide fingerprint resources and the cost.

Another item discussed at the NM Medical Society (NMMS) was recruiting NM residents-in-training to remain in NM; currently only 25% stay. The NMMS wants to increase that percentage. They plan to hold a job fair on November 30, 2007. They suggested the NMMB waive the licensing fee from resident to permanent. Senator Steve Komadina was present at the meeting and said he would sponsor a bill to that affect. They also want to know if there are any ways for the NMMB to make the licensure process easier.

The NMMS has concerns about changes to the monitored treatment program.

California has announced they were eliminating their diversion program.

California has determined the diversion program was not effective and plan to consider a monitored treatment program similar to the one New Mexico uses

12. MEDICAL USE OF CANNABIS ACT – Dr. Steve Jenison, Dept. of Health:

Dr Steve Jenison, Medical Director, Department of Health, provided the Board an update on Senate Bill 523. The Department of Health (DOH) has created a registry for people that have a prescription and medical diagnosis for use of medical cannabis. As part of the application review, each referring physician is contacted by Dr Jenison. Since the registry began on July 1, 2007, thirty people have been enrolled. The people enrolled suffer from diagnoses such as cancer, spinal cord transaction with intractable spasticity, multiple sclerosis, HIV or AIDS. Approved applicants get a card in the mail indicating what being enrolled in the program means. The production and distribution portion of the Bill are currently on hold. There will be a public hearing on October 1, 2007 on the permanent rules in the main auditorium of the Runnels. Building. The Board invited Dr. Jenison to attend their November meeting for an update.

Ms Hart brought forth the issue of a Board Member Code of Conduct for
discussion as the Governmental Conduct Act requires all state agencies to adopt a Code
of Conduct. The discussion included whether or not board members have a
responsibility or obligation to report to the other members' issues such as arrests,
