6. REPORTS

Chair Report

Dr. Jenkusky welcomed new Board Member Karen Carson, MD.

Interim Director

Ms. Dieterich informed the Board that the Governor's Office had interviewed Ms. Frank for the Executive Director position and that their Office should inform the Board of their approval by the end of this week.

Ms. Dieterich also updated the Board on the status of vacancies. Currently, there are three staff positions that are vacant and need to be filled as soon as possible – one in licensing, one in Investigations and one to assist Ms. Mascarenas with financials. These should be filled within the next month, other than the position in financials, which cannot be advertised until July 1.

Ms. Dieterich informed the Board that the agency has been contracting with two prosecutors to handle the Board's administrative cases. Ms. Dieterich introduced Patrick McNertney, Esquire; and Scott Fuqua, Esquire. The cases are being distributed between both attorneys.

Medical Director

Dr. La Farge updated the Board on the 2015 FSMB Annual Meeting which was held on April 23-25, in Fort Worth, TX. He stated that there has been controversy and a lawsuit between the Texas Medical Board (TMB) and Teladoc, a large company that practices telemedicine on the Internet. Because the TMB requires an established physician-patient relationship, like NM, it attempted to block the prescription of medicines by Teladoc without an established physician-patient relationship. Teladoc has taken the TMB to court on an anti-trust charge for adopting specific rules on April 10, 2015 regarding the physician-patient relationship and prescribing.

Dr. La Farge also updated the Board with respect to the North Carolina Antitrust Case. This case was based on the NC Board of Dental Examiners having issued 47 cease and desist" letter to individuals practicing "teeth-whitening" in spas and kiosks who were not licensed to "practice dentistry". The Federal Trade Commission ruled against the NC Dental Board largely because they did not have jurisdiction over the "teeth-whitener" practitioners and thus no authority to move to discipline them. The FTC also ruled that the NC Dental Board was not actively-supervised by the NC legislature.

Dr. La Farge concluded by updating the status of the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact. Strong emphasis was placed on the concepts under which the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact was created in order to assist expedited, multiple state licensure while maintaining licensing and regulation within the states of licensure (not nationally or regionally). Six states have received legislative endorsement of a Compact: MT, ID, WY, UT, SD and WV. MI and AL are on the verge of completing the legislative process, thus making the number adequate (7) for establishing a multi-state Compact. An additional eleven state legislatures are currently reviewing Compact Bills: NV, TX, OK, NE, MN, IA, IL, MD, RI, NH, and VT. Other states, including NM, are waiting to see how the Compact structure actually works.

Board Attorney

Ms. Frank updated the Board on the status of the pending appellate cases.

Mark Walden, M.D., who appealed the Board's most recent Order requiring him to complete a residency, has filed an appeal in First Judicial District Court and is representing himself. The record proper was filed by the Board but Dr. Walden has not submitted an appellate statement so the Board is waiting to see what he is appealing.

Sitar Kothalanka, M.D.'s appellate case is still pending. Oral argument was heard in this case in February, but the Judge has not yet issued a decision. This case was assigned to Judge Victor Lopez in the Second Judicial District Court.

Mr. Paul Bateman's hearing in the matter of the Board's Petition for Temporary Restraining Order has been vacated since he has not been located in order to serve him with same. Mr. Bateman is the unlicensed practitioner issuing CDLs to truck drivers out of a truck stop in Albuquerque. The hearing will be rescheduled once he is served.

Licensing Manager

Ms. Quintana reported to the Board that there are approximately 1,850 MD Licensees who have not submitted their Pain Management CME to the Board office. She also reported that there is already a rule in place, 16.10.4.13 B, which allows for the Board to offer an MD who is unable to provide required documentation of CME a settlement in lieu of initiating disciplinary action. Settlements may include a letter of reprimand and a \$500.00 fine which would be reportable. After a brief discussion by the Board it was determined that licensees currently in renewal that have not submitted the documentation will be not be renewed until CME is submitted. In addition, letters will be mailed to all other licensees who have not submitted their CME explaining the possible settlement. The Board wants to make it clear that licensees will be held accountable if they are not in compliance with the Pain Management CME requirement.

Financial / HR Manager

Ms. Dieterich reported for Ms. Mascarenas in her absence.

Ms. Dieterich reported on FY15 Budget and Status Report ending March 31, 2015 this agency has expenditures totaling \$1,230,000 from July 1, 2014 to March 31, 2015. The revenue we've collected from July 1, 2014 to March 31, 2015 totals \$546,600. Ms. Dieterich stated that our cash balance as of May 11, 2015 is \$2,185,800 and our litigation expenses have totaled \$15,400 with \$39,300 encumbered.

The FY16 HB2 approved operating budget, which begins on July 1, 2015, is \$1,844,500, a decrease of 2.2% compared to the FY15 operating budget. We also have BAR authority of \$100,000 for administrative hearing and litigation expenditures.

Investigations Department

Ms. Dieterich did not have anything to report.

Administrative Prosecutor

Ms. Dieterich reported on the status of pending administrative prosecution cases.

MOTION was made by Dr. Jenkusky to **GRANT** Dr. Kamermans' Request to Amend Stipulation and remove the preceptor requirement. **SECONDED:** Ms. Anderson. **YES:** Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Spence; Dr. Komadina; Dr. Beaudette and Mr. Bourbon. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Jimmie Charlie, M.D. – Requesting Release from Stipulation

MOTION was made by Dr. Jenkusky to release Dr. Charlie from the Board Stipulated Order. **SECONDED:** Ms. Anderson. **YES:** Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Spence; Dr. Komadina: Dr. Beaudette and Mr. Bourbon. **MOTION CARRIED**

Dr. Komadina had a brief discussion regarding the roles of Board members and stated he would like the members of the Board to have more communication with Board staff so that the Board can be more actively engaged in and aware of the daily issues at the Board office.

ADJOURN

Dr. Jenkusky adjourned the first day [May 14, 2015] of the May Regular Board Meeting at 5:10 p.m.

Friday, May 15, 2015

Dr. Jenkusky reconvened the Medical Board and called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, May 15, 2015; a quorum was present.

8. Presentation by Ralph Loomis, M.D. and Jonathan Jagoda, FSMB

Dr. Loomis and Mr. Jagoda presented to the Board the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact and the need for license portability. They are pursuing expanding access for licensure while at the same time protecting patients. The Compact is a contract between participating states meant to simplify the licensure process across state lines. Dr. Loomis and Mr. Jagoda explained that participation is not mandatory for providers, who may apply directly to individual state boards if they wish. In order to qualify for licensure using the compact, the provider must have a full, unrestricted license in a state that is a member of the Compact. The provider must comply with all state regulations and rules, and the state maintains jurisdiction over the license. The Compact is a mechanism to expedite licensure in multiple states.

9. Presentation by Jon Thayer – Diversion Programs

Mr. Thayer presented to the Board how a diversion program would work, and the benefits such a program might offer to the Board and licensees. A Diversion Program is a concept that facilitates the rehabilitation of a licensee without applying disciplinary action upon the license. Providers would be able to enter the program voluntarily or through Board referral. Benefits of such a program include reduction of the cost of investigation, early intervention and public safety. The drawback is public acceptance. Dr. Jenkusky suggested a committee be formed charged with the development of a diversion program. Dr. Jenkusky and Mr. Wallace volunteered as the Board members serving on the committee.

10. Presbyterian Representative – Broader Use of Telemedicine to Deliver Care to Patients

Dr. Kevin Maven and Robyn Divine presented to the Board the use of internet telemedicine in the state of New Mexico. Presbyterian partnered with a company by the name of MeMD which allows access to healthcare at any time of day through the use of an internet connection and a webcam. MeMd maintains its own electronic documentation of the visit, which can be forwarded to PCP upon request. Concerns exist as to what can be treated with a virtual visit. If an issue cannot be resolved during a virtual visit, the patient is given a strategy on what their next step should be. This is not meant to replace traditional care, but to provide additional methods for patients to obtain treatment. Since this program has been initiated there have been 800 visits, and the average time is about 45 minutes from registration to completion of the appointment. Patients can also schedule future appointments.

11. New Business

MOTION was made by Dr. Komadina to nominate Dr. Jenkusky as Chair of the Board.

MOTION was made by Dr. Beaudette to nominate Dr. Komadina as Chair of the Board.

The nominees gave statements as to why they would like to be chair and what they plan to do if nominated as Chair.

Dr. Spence suggested that the candidate who is not elected Chair serve as Vice Chair. Dr. Komadina indicated he would not have the time to serve as Vice Chair.

The Board Members then voted.

Dr. Jenkusky for Chair: **YES:** Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Mr. Wallace; and Mr. Bourbon. **RECUSED:** Dr. Jenkusky.

Dr. Komadina for Chair: YES: Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Komadina; and Dr. Spence.

Dr. Jenkusky, by vote of 4-3, was elected Chair of the Board. MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION was made by Dr. Jenkusky to nominate Mr. Bourbon as Vice Chair of the Board. SECONDED: Dr. Beaudette. YES: Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Komadina; Mr. Wallace and Dr. Spence. MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION was made by Dr. Spence to nominate Ms. Anderson as Secretary-Treasurer of the Board. SECONDED: Dr. Jenkusky, YES: Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Carson; Dr. Komadina; Mr. Wallace; Dr. Spence and Mr. bourbon . MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION was made by Dr. Spence to move forward and create a committee to oversee the process for forming a Diversion Program. Mr. Wallace and Dr. Jenkusky volunteered to serve as the Board Members on the Committee. SECONDED: Dr. Jenkusky, YES: Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Komadina; Mr. Wallace; Dr. Spence and Mr. Bourbon . MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION was made by Mr. Wallace to adopt the Open Meetings Resolution. SECONDED: Dr. Jenkusky. YES: Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Komadina; Mr. Wallace; Dr. Spence and Mr. Bourbon . MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION was made by Dr. Jenkusky to adopt the language for the Proposed Rule Amendment to 16.10.2.8 and vote on a later date. **SECONDED:** Dr. Carson. **YES:** Dr. Jenkusky; Dr. Beaudette; Dr. Carson; Ms. Anderson; Dr. Komadina; Mr. Wallace; Dr. Spence and Mr. Bourbon . MOTION CARRIED.

The proposed meeting dates will be settled at the August Meeting.

Ms. Frank discussed expungement from our administrative cases, stating that in general we do not expunge records. There would have to be an unusual set of circumstances in which the Board would look at expungement. Also, expungements are not removed from the NPDB as NPDB has their own regulation on how that issue is handled.

12. **Old Business**

Ms. Compton updated the Board on the response to the advisory letters sent out by Board staff regarding the Board's PMP Rule. Thirty-five letters were sent out and an array of responses were received. Most of the physicians who responded work in clinics that have one staff member pull PMP's for all practitioners. Ms. Compton referred physicians to the Pharmacy Board to ensure the delegate is registered to each Physician.

There was a discussion held on how to get information to the public and licensees more quickly and in a manner that is actually more efficient. Dr. Carson and Dr. Komadina both use social media in their own practices. Dr. Carson and Ms. Compton were tasked to explore creating a Facebook page for the Board in order to make various information more readily available to the public.

13. **ADJOURN**

There being no further business before the Board, Dr. Jenkusky adjourned the meeting at 12:30 p.m.
